Language Interpreter Training

Certificate Program (LITP/LNI)

This Seneca College Certificate program is 180 hours in duration and includes 6 subjects that integrate theories, principles, concepts and practical application as well as the skills development required for the field of interpretation. The subjects are 30 hours and they are offered once or twice per week evenings and/or weekends. In addition, the accelerated schedule allows participants to complete 2 courses per semester.

Entry Requirements/Prerequisites

- o Mastery of both English and an additional language is required.
- o Participants must complete an English Assessment &Placement, EAP100, or apply for Advanced Standing in order to ensure they meet the English requirements.
- o Prerequisite ESL089 and ESL934/EAC149 or equivalent.
